



featured project **MOOREGLEN FARMS**

Mooreglen Farms is one of the few active dairy farms in the Sarnia area. Parents Mel and Becky Anderson, along with their son Joe and his wife Kristie, own and operate the farm. They have four children who are in school and help with the farm chores. One thing you need to know about Joe, when he says he's busy in the fields, he's not talking about tractor work - he is an avid hunter and is likely tracking his next dinner!

In 1998, DLS installed a GEA D-6 herringbone parlour with a small holding area and 178 stalls at Mooreglen Farms. It served its purpose for many years, but with their growth they needed a larger parlour and free stall barn with more stalls and feed bunk space to accommodate the growing herd. The new milking facility was a complete DLS turnkey project. It features a 470' x 110' DLS Structure, a DLS / GEA vertical lift parallel milking parlour with individual indexing (expandable to D-20), a subway, Daritech Biolynt flush system, Jourdain stabling with deep bedded sand stalls, ACME panel fans, and GEA manure equipment.

The cows moved into the new barn and parlour in the middle of May 2018. Milking 240 cows, the Anderson's cut their milking time in half compared to the old parlour. Joe Anderson says that "Everything has improved since moving into the new barn. It's a much better environment for the cows, and for us to manage. The cows are healthier and performing better. After being in the barn for half a year now, we can see that the cows are milking calmer (very little kicking in the parlour), we've had very few incidences of mastitis, hoof trimming has been reduced with the benefits of sand bedding, and we're excited to see that milk production has increased by about 10%."

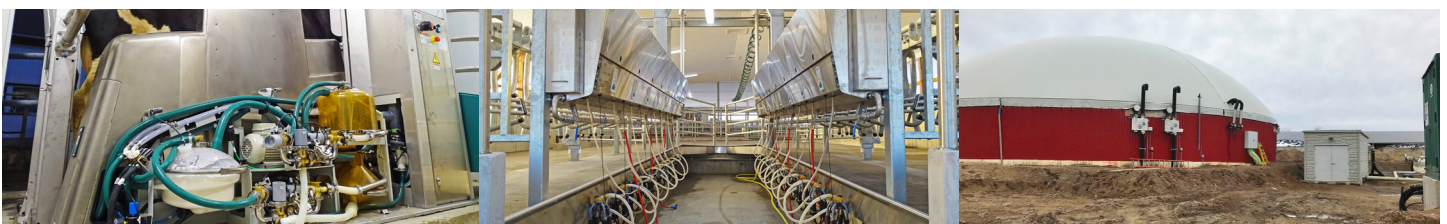

Bretzler Farms

Crysler, ON

DLS commissioned the 250 kW anaerobic digester at Bretzler Farms this past month. It is a 30m diameter digester which translates to 3,600m³ of active volume. Included in this digester is a double membrane biogas storage roof, three mix agitation nozzles, two 150m³ low temperature pasteurizer / liquids receiving tanks, technical container, and a waste gas flare. The Bretzler family milks 270 cows.
