







## featured project **SONNEBERG DAIRY LTD.**

Sonneberg Dairy Ltd. was established in 1995 when the Pelleboer family immigrated from the Netherlands. Prior to this Gerrit Pelleboer and his family were dairy farmers in Holland. Gerrit's future wife, Sally, grew up on a beef feedlot and cash crop farm in Wyoming, ON. Gerrit and Sally met at Ridgetown College where they both graduated from the agriculture program in 2001. They were married in 2005 and now have three children, Femka, Lane and Roamie. In 2012 Gerrit & Sally officially took over the family farm. Sally is also a sales associate for Tillvalley Farms selling Dupont pioneer products.

There is lots of work to be done at Sonneberg Dairy! The family milks 400 cows and farms 1,250 acres. They grow all of their own feed, and they cash crop some acres. In addition to this, custom harvest work is done for a few neighbours. The Pelleboer's believe they have an excellent team of employees that contribute to the success of their farm.

After touring some cross-vent barns in Wisconsin, they decided to build a 500 cow cross-vent barn in hopes to increase cow comfort and production. "We were very impressed with the simplicity and efficiency of this type of barn. The controlled temperature environment is comfortable and more consistent for the cows." The manure alleys are manually scraped with tractor and blade for simplicity.


